



A quick guide to funding Green projects

Green funding and grants

- [Local community foundations](#) administer funds on behalf of others. They often have funding relating to green energy projects and carbon reduction.
- [Awards for All](#) offer grants of up to £20k.

- For small grants contact your local county councillor as they may have a delegated fund for community projects. You might also want to contact your town or parish council.
- Civic groups e.g. Round Table Rotary or Lions may have funding for community projects.
- Supermarkets often have funding available for charities and groups that are located near to one of their stores. You can find further information on their websites.
- Funding may be available if your project is located within or near a National Park, AONB, or near large developments such as wind turbines, mines or waste disposal sites.
- Current and local energy providers often offer initiatives or grant schemes for customers.
